TRAINING:

Professional up-to-date courses, lectures and seminars are regularly held where not only members of the Association but also outsiders may participate. As an example we can mention the following tracks, each one including several subjects: Software Engineering, Software Maintenance, Productivity and Quality, Management Methodology, Optimization and Simulation, Informatics and Education, Programming, Communications and so on.

Forums where experts discuss modern methodologies and tools in specific areas and report their personal experiences in the application of that mechanisms in their working environment (industry, university or research) and well known companies have the possibility of showing the software and hardware products that they offer to the market. Society's Major Activities

The society has five standing committees and seventeen working and special-interest groups, active in a great number of fields, from the technical to the pragmatic (e.g. legislation and

contracts). In addition, the society offers seminars on various areas of information processing at a high academic level. The seminars are intended for career-advancement training.

Computers for handicapped persons is a major focus of the society, which has organized the fourth **International Conference on Computers for Handicapped Persons in Vienna** in 1994. In 1995 an **International Congress on Intellectual Property Rights for Specialized Information and Knowledge (KnowRight'95)** will take place in Vienna on 21-25 August 1995. And in 1998, the **IFIP World Computer Congress** will be jointly organized by the Austrian Computer Society and the Hungarian John v. Neumann Computer Society in Budapest and Vienna.

Each year the society administers a programming competition for young people, which is sponsored by the Austrian Ministry of Education and Arts.

Biennially, the society grants the **Heinz Zemanek Award** (in honour of Prof. Heinz Zemanek, IFIP's fourth president and Honorary Member) to a deserving recipient of research in the field of informatics and computer science. An additional award is given annually to talented university students in the area of informatics.

In 1982 the society created a regional subsidiary, the **Institute for Applied Information Processing in Graz**. The institute is devoted to interdisciplinary research, coordinating the activities of institutes in the region of Graz concerned with information processing.

The society also sponsors conferences, seminars and lectures.

The society publishes a journal six times a year, which contains information about new trends in Information Technology, papers from the working groups and institutional and individual members of the society, reports from research projects, calendar of events etc...

The society also publishes a book series in the field of Information Technology. 73 volumes have been published since 1975.

Since 1974 EUROMICRO has been active in Europe. Dissemination of information is mostly performed through channels such as a journal, a yearly conference and workshop on Real-Time Systems and workshop on Parallel and Distributed Processing. The publications of Euromicro during this period is more than 15000 pages of submitted material. Euromicro members belong to all the European countries, plus some in the US, South America and Asia. Membership encompasses a mix of academia and industry, thus allowing Euromicro to reach both the scientific and the industrial world.

The structure of Euromicro foresees a Board of Directors (two per country) whose task is that of promoting Euromicro's activities within their country and a council dealing with managerial matters and designing the strategy of the organization. The two editors-in-chief of the journal, aided by a wide set of referees, decide the contents of the various issues of the journal, evaluate the proposal for special issue on particular topics and so on. Every event (conference-workshop)

Research institute of the Academy affiliated with sections: social sciences (18), mathematical, physical and chemical sciences (16), technical sciences (10), agricultural and forestry sciences (7), medical sciences (8), earth and mining sciences (8 institutes) are independent in the choice of research subject. The important source of scientific inspiration of the PAS research centres are the assessments of the scientific development made by 104 scientific committees affiliating over 400 specialists. Due to the PAS initiative S. Banach International Mathematical Centre in Warsaw and International Centre of Biocybernetics in Warsaw have been established. Outside

Society's Major Activities

STRUCTURE

The Society consists of individuals and corporate bodies who have been admitted to membership because of their interests and skills in the information processing field. Members of the Society annually elect an Executive Council. The Executive Council in turn elects a President and Vice-Presidents. The Council is assisted by a full-time Secretariat in Midrand. The Society also has Chapters in all major centers. These Chapters meet regularly and organize lectures, seminars, luncheons, etc. Most Chapters operate Special Interest Groups in a variety of specialist areas.

ANNUAL AWARDS

The Computer Society runs a National Computer Personality of the Year Award Programme. Nominations for the Computer Personality of the Year award are judged by a panel of past presidents and the results are announced before an audience drawn from the whole of the computing industry. Various regional awards are also made, including bursaries for worthy students at Universities and Technikons.

COMPUTER OLYMPIAD

The aim of the Olympiad is to promote and encourage the spread of computer education in schools, to identify and reward computer aptitude and to bring about awareness of the potential uses of computers.

It is sponsored by Old Mutual and run in conjunction with the CSSA, which is responsible for the final judging of entries. By 1990 it had grown to the biggest event of its kind in the world!

Two of the top participants will be sponsored to take part in the International Olympiad in Informatics.

So far the Conference has been held in 14 countries in 5 continents: North America, South America, Asia, Australia, and Europe. Typically a VLDB conference attracts about 300 submitted scientific papers, and is attended by 5-600 delegates. The VLDB Endowment supports every conference with seed money. The VLDB surplus is half of the total surplus of the conference. Surplus money is used by the Endowment to support future conferences and other scholarly activities, such as the VLDB Journal.

Society's Major Activities

The Society is administered by a National Council who meet every two months to hear reports and make decisions regarding control of Society activities and on the day to day running of Society business.

The day to day business of the Society is handled by the Chapter Committees and by the Secretariat.

- **MONTHLY FUNCTIONS:** These are usually open meetings at which an invited speaker addresses members and guests either on technical issues or topical issues. There may also be social functions such as lunches, dinners or cocktails.

- MEMBERSHIP LIAISON: Existing members are invited to put forward their views of discussion sessions held during the monthly functions, and applications for membership are welcome.
- EDUCATION: The Chapters are involved with education of members and the general public via functions and seminars. They are also tasked with providing guidance and assistance for schools and colleges teaching Information Processing subjects, and with the annual inspections of Training Institute who are Associated to the Computer Society.
- SPECIAL PROJECTS: These involve organisation of projects such as lectures, seminars, surveys, competitions and meetings which may occur on a "one-time-only" or regular basis.
- SUMMER SCHOOL: The Society holds an annual residential seminar as Summerschool, for members at a resort hotel. This is organised by either of the Chapter committees, but over the years has become a national event attended by high calibre members of both Chapters. The programme usually includes discussions regarding Computer Society activities.
- SCHOOLS BUSINESS MANAGEMENT GAMES: The Computer Society of Zimbabwe and Institute of Chartered Accountants are joint sponsors of the National Schools Business Management Games run in conjunction with the Computer Processing Group.

The Secretariat handles the main day to day administrative workload of the Society including:-

- MEMBERSHIP REGISTER: Maintenance of an up-to-date register of members names and addresses, and provision of labels for circulation of function and special notices, newsletters, ballots, etc.
- MEMBERSHIP BILLING: Billing of annual membership subscriptions, receipting these when they are received and sending out statements as required.
